BY-LAW 07-36

OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CLEARVIEW

Being a By-Law to regulate the parking of vehicles within the Township of Clearview.

WHEREAS Section 11(3) of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001 c.25, as amended, empowers the councils of local municipalities to pass by-laws prohibiting parking on municipal property, prohibiting or regulating the pairing, standing or stopping of vehicles or classes thereof on a highway,

AND WHEREAS Section 63 (1) of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. c.25 as amended, says that if a municipality passes a by-law for prohibiting or regulating the placing, stopping, standing or parking of an object or vehicles on or near a highway, it may provide for the removal and impounding or restraining and immobilizing of any object or vehicles placed, stopped, standing or parked on or near a highway in contravention of the by-law. C.32. Sched. A s.27.

AND WHEREAS Section 170 (15) of Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990 c.H.8 says a police officer, police cadet, municipal law enforcement officer or an officer appointed for carrying out the provisions of this Act, upon discovery of any vehicle parked or standing in contravention of subsection (12), of a regulation made under subsection 26 (3) of the Public Transportation and Highway improvement Act or of a municipal By-Law, may cause it to be moved or taken to and placed or stored in a suitable place and all costs and charges for the removal, care and storage of the vehicle, if any, are a lien upon the vehicle, which may be enforced in the manner provided by the Repair and Storage Liens Act. 2005, c.26. Sched. A, s. 28 (2).

AND WHEREAS Section 427 of the Municipal Act 2001. S.O. 2001, c.25 says a By-Law establishing a system of disabled parking shall provide that every person who contravenes the By-Law is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable to a fine of not less than \$300. 2006, c. 32, Sched. A, s. 184.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Clearview deems it necessary and expedient to pass a By-Law to regulate parking of vehicles on highways and municipal property.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 <u>Title and Scope</u>

1.1.1 This is a by-law to regulate parking of vehicles within the Township of Clearview. This shall be known as the "Parking Control By-Law" for the Township of Clearview.

1.2 <u>Repeal of former By-Laws</u>

1.2.1 Former By-Laws 01-48, 03-27 and 05-06 for the Township of Clearview are hereby repealed upon the effective date of this By-Law.

1.3 <u>Validity and Severability</u>

1.3.1 Should any section, subsection, paragraph, or provision of this By-Law be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the same shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provisions of this By-Law or the By-Law as a whole.

1.4 Interpretation

1.4.1 Words used singular shall have corresponding meanings when used in the plural.

1.4.2 "May" shall be construed as permissive.

1.4.3 "Shall" shall be construed as imperative.

1.5 Force and Effect

This By-Law shall come into force and effect on the day that it receives the approval of Council of the Township of Clearview.

2. DEFINITIONS

2.1 **"Authorized Sign" means any sign on a highway, any curb or sidewalk marking** or other device, placed or erected on a highway under the authority of this By-Law for the purpose of regulating parking.

2.2 **"Designated No Parking Zone" means any location which has been designated by** By-Law as an area where parking is prohibited and authorized signs have been erected.

2.3 **"Designated No Standing Zone" means any location which has been designated** by By-**Law as a "Designated No Stopping Zone" and authorized signs have been** erected.

2.4 "Designated No Stopping Zone" includes:

a) Any location that stopping has been prohibited by By-Law and authorized signs have been erected.

b) A school zone between the hours of 8.30am and 4.30pm on any day when school is open and authorized signs have been erected.

2.5 **"Designated Disabled Person Parking Area(s)" means a parking area designated** by By-Law as being reserved solely for the use of a vehicle operated by or on behalf of a physically disabled person and authorized signs have been erected.

2.6 **"Disabled person Parking Permit" means a disabled person-**parking permit issued under the authority of the Highway Traffic Act and regulations made under the Act.

2.7 **"Emergency Services Vehicle" means an ambulance, fire department vehicle,** police vehicle or rescue vehicle.

2.8 **"Highway" includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway,** driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct, or trestle, any part of which is intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles and includes the area intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles and includes the area between the lateral property lines thereof

2.9 **"Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of** the lateral curb lines, or if none, then the lateral boundary lines of two or more highways that join one another at an angle, whether or not one highway crosses the other.

2.10 **"Motor Vehicle" includes an automobile, motorcycle, motor assisted bicycle and** any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than muscular power and does not include a motorized snow vehicle, traction engine, farm tractor, self-propelled instrument of husbandry or road building machine.

2.11 **"Municipal Parking Lot" means any area that is not a highway, owned or** maintained by the Township for parking of vehicles.

2.12 **"Park" or "Parking", when prohibited means the standing of a vehicle, whether** occupied or not, except when standing temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading of merchandise or passengers.

2.13 **"Pedestrian Crossover" means any portion of a roadway, designated by By**-Law of a municipality, at an intersection or elsewhere, distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by signs on the highway and lines or other markings on the surface of the roadway as prescribed by the regulations under the Highway Traffic Act R.S.O. 1990, Chapter H.8.

2.14 "Prohibited location" means any location as outlined in Section 3(1) of this By-Law.

2.15 **"Public Utility Vehicle" means a vehicle operated on behalf of a public utility** including a hydro electric utility, water utility, telephone company or natural gas company.

2.16 **"Roadway" means the part of the highway that is improved, designed or** ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, but does not include the shoulder, and, where a highway includes two or more separate roadways, the term "roadway" refers to any one roadway separately and not to all of the roadways collectively.

2.17 **"Sidewalk" means that portion of a highway between the curb lines, the lateral** lines of a roadway and the adjacent property lines, intended for the use of pedestrians.

2.18 **"Stand" or "Standing" when prohibited, means the halting of a vehicle, whether** occupied or not, except for the purpose and while actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers.

2.19 **"Stop" or "Stopping", when prohibited, means the halting of a vehicle, whether** occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in the compliance with the direction of a police officer or of a traffic control sign or signal.

2.20 **"Township" s**hall mean the Corporation of the Township of Clearview.

2.21 "Township Clerk", shall mean the Clerk for the Township of Clearview.

2.22 "Vehicle", includes a motor vehicle, trailer, traction engine, farm tractor, road building machine, bicycle, motorized snow vehicle, and any vehicle drawn, propelled or driven by any kind of power, including muscular power.

2.23 **"Zoning By-Law" means the prevailing Zoning By**-Law(s) in force and effect in the Township of Clearview.

2.24 **"Designated Bus Loading Zone" me**ans an area designated by By-Law as being reserved solely for the use of school buses or buses engaged in the transportation of students between the hours of 8.30am and 4.30pm on days when the school is open to students.

2.25 **"Person" shall mean and include the operator or person having** care and control of a vehicle, an individual company, partnership, corporation, limited company or the registered owner of a vehicle.

2.26 **"Fire Chief" means the Chief of the Corporation of the Township of Clearview Fire** Department.

2.27 **"Heavy Commercial Vehicle" means a commercially licenced vehicle in excess of** 3,000 kilograms gross vehicle weight or unladen weight.

- 2.28 "Residential Zone" means any highway that runs adjacent to any property that is zoned residential according to the Township's Zoning By-Law 06-54 as amended.
 - 3. OFFENCES
- 3.1 No person shall park a motor vehicle:
 - a) So as to obstruct a sidewalk
 - b) Within an intersection
 - c) So as to obstruct a private driveway or laneway
 - d) So as to obstruct a pedestrian crosswalk
 - e) So as to interfere with the movement of traffic
 - f) On a highway within 9 metres of an intersection
 - g) On a highway within 3 metres of a fire hydrant
 - h) Within a school bus loading zone;
 - i) On a highway within 152 metres of firefighting apparatus while said apparatus is actually engaged in fighting a fire, or any greater distance directed by a police officer or member of the fire department.
 - j) On a highway within 7 metres of the entrance-way to a fire hall on the same side of the highway that the fire hall is located or within 30 (thirty) metres of the entrance way to a fire hall on the opposite side of the highway.
 - k) On a bridge.
 - I) Within a "designated no parking zone"

3.2 No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in any area where parking is prohibited by the Fire Marshall

3.3 No person shall stand or park a vehicle in a "Designated No Standing Zone"

3.4 In an area designated as an angle parking area, no person shall park a vehicle having a greater length than 6.1 metres.

3.5 No person shall park a motor vehicle on any highway unless the motor vehicle is parallel to and not more than thirty (30) centimetres to the curb or boundary of the highway. This section shall not apply where angle or perpendicular parking is permitted.

3.6 No person shall park a vehicle on a highway unless on the right hand side of the highway having regard to the direction in which the motor vehicle had been proceeding. This section does not apply to parking of a motor vehicle on the left side of a designated one-way highway unless prohibited by sign.

3.7 Where the properly worded signs are erected and are on display, no person shall park a vehicle within 13.7 metres of an intersection.

3.8 No person shall stand a motor vehicle, other than a commercial motor vehicle, unattended unless it is locked in such a manner as to prevent its operation by any person not authorized by the owner, driver or person in charge.

3.9 No person shall park a vehicle on any highway or road way between the hours of 1:00 AM and 6:00 AM

3.9.1 Section 3.9 does not apply during the period from April 15 to October 15 of the same year.

3.10 No person shall park in vehicle on a highway, Municipal Parking Lot or other property owned by the Township in a manner that would interfere with the convenient removal of snow.

3.11 No person shall park an unlicenced vehicle on any Municipal Parking Lot or other property owned by the Township.

3.12 No person shall park a vehicle on any Municipal Parking Lot for more than 48 consecutive hours unless express permission has been obtained from the Township Clerk.

3.13 No person shall park a vehicle on a highway for more than 24 consecutive hours.

3.14 Where properly worded signs have been erected and are on display, no person shall park a vehicle on the highways set out hereunder for a period longer than two (2) hours between the hours of 6.00 AM and 6.00 PM Monday to Saturday inclusive of each week.

3.15 No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in a designated "Disabled Person Parking Area", unless that person is the driver of a motor vehicle on which a valid "Disabled Person Parking Permit" issued and displayed in accordance with the Highway

Traffic Act and regulations made under it, is properly displayed on the vehicle and which is being driven by or is carrying one or more physically disabled persons.

3.16 Where properly worded signs have been erected and are on display, no person shall park a vehicle on the highways set out hereunder for a period longer than one (1) hour between the hours of 8:00 AM and 6:00 PM, Mondays to Fridays inclusive of each week.

13.6.1 "Section 3.1 5does not apply to a vehicle displaying a Parking Permit in a prominent location in the front windshield of the vehicle"

3.17 No person shall stop a vehicle in a Designated No Stopping Zone".

3.18 No person shall stand or park a vehicle in any Township Fire Station parking lot unless authorized by the Fire Chief or his designate.

Fire Stations

- 1. 204 Stayner Street
- 2. 5212 County Road 9
- 3. 7655 County Road 9
- 4. 794055 County Road 124
- 5. 95 Batteaux Road
- 3.19 No person shall park a heavy commercial vehicle in a residential zone.

4. PENALTY

Every person who contravenes any section of this By-Law is guilty of an offence and, upon conviction, is subject to a penalty under the Provincial Offences Act.

5. CONTINUING OFFENCE

Each day that a situation as described in Section 3 of this By-Law is allowed to continue shall constitute a separate offence under this By-Law and any Judge or Justice of the Peace adjudicating on such matter may assess a separate fine for each and every day that such situation has been allowed to continue.

6. ADDITIONAL REMEDY

6.1 Any motor vehicle found in violation of any section of this By-law may be removed and stored under the direction of the Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, or any person designated by this By-law. Any such costs or charges incurred through such removal care and storage will become a lien upon the vehicle which may be enforced in the manner provided by the Repair Storage and Liens Act, 2005, C.26. Sched. A. s.28(2).

6.2 For the purpose of Section 6.1, the following persons shall be considered as designated persons:

- a) Any Township employee while acting in his/her capacity as an employee and dealing with a vehicle parked on property owned by the Township
- b) Any person designated in writing by the Director of Public Works in the circumstances contained in the designation.
- c) Any police officer in lawful execution of his/her lawful duties.

7. EXEMPTIONS

The following are exempt from any provision of this By-Law:

- a) Vehicles owned by or operated on behalf of the Township
- b) Vehicles owned by or operated on behalf of a police department
- c) Emergency Services Vehicles while providing emergency service, or
- d) A public Utility Vehicle when providing emergent or urgent service or repairs.
- e) Vehicles unable to proceed due to traffic congestion or back-up.
- f) Vehicles required to stop under the provisions of the Ontario Highway Traffic Act or other provincial or federal legislation.

8. EFFECTIVE DATE

This By-law becomes effective upon the date of receipt of the approval of the "Set Fines" as set out in Schedule "B", by the Ministry of the Attorney General.

BY-LAW NUMBER 07-36 read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 11th day of June 2007.

Furthermore, it does not apply to implements of husbandry and commercial vehicles while engaged in agricultural activities at the location of Concession 4 Nottawasaga (Fairgrounds Road) and Sideroad 33/34 Nottawasaga.
