# Investigation of Open Alcohol at Village Green Park

Council received the Investigation of Open Alcohol at Village Green Park report for information. After a presentation from the Creemore Community Foundation at the May 26<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting, Council directed staff to investigate permitting open alcohol at the Creemore Village Green.

Staff conducted research, including the City of Toronto model, requirements under the Alcohol & Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO), the updates that would be required to the Village Green Management Agreement, insurance coverage considerations and Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit (SMDHU) health concerns.

#### **Centerline Road Reconstruction**

Council awarded the tender for the Centerline Road Reconstruction to Arnill Construction for \$2,888,888.88 excluding HST. Construction will begin in September.

## Short Term Rental Accommodation Licensing – Survey Results

Council received the survey results report for information. The survey was open for a month with 213 responses received, 97% of which were from Clearview residents. The results show that a majority of the community (60%) support a Short Term Rental Accommodation program. The open comments show concerns and advantages in seven main areas: Noise & property standards, housing stock and housing type, permanent residents vs. transient quests, municipal resources, tourism, licensing and inspection requirements, fees & Municipal Accommodation Tax (MAT). Staff will begin drafting a licensing by-law which will be released in the fall for Council and public/stakeholder engagement.
