Administration – Council

Celebrate Clearview's 25th birthday, DC Study Update, Asset Management Plan, Stayner Cemetery Survey for expansion, Accessibility improvements for the Council chambers.

Economic Development

\$100,000 for beautification and \$100,000 for improving the look of our communities through a grant process.

Information Services

Scheduled replacement of computers and software. Server upgrades and equipment replacements. Website update and improvements.

Fire and Emergency Services:

Fire Master Plan, 10 year SCBA replacement, utility truck and regular equipment replacement.

Creemore Medical Centre

Self-funded – no funding from taxation.

Parks and Recreation

New Citizen's award program

Continuation of Small Halls Festival, replace ticketing website, update of Recreation Master Plan, vehicle replacements, quench buggy for events, replace signage, Stayner Hall renovation. Major service enhancements at Youth Centre.

Stayner Arena

Replace boards, arena renovations and new ice pad edger.

Creemore Arena

Replace curling rink dehumidifier and fix up washrooms.

Stayner Parks

Centennial park Pavilion, Station Park Redevelopment Phase 1 and improve community garden.

Other Parks

Repair New Lowell pavilion, skateboard park pad, duntroon dog park. Duntroon hall water treatment equipment..

Library Services

\$85,920 for new collection materials, \$11,000 for new computers. Complete construction on replacement Stayner branch, continue fundraising.

Water and Sewer Services

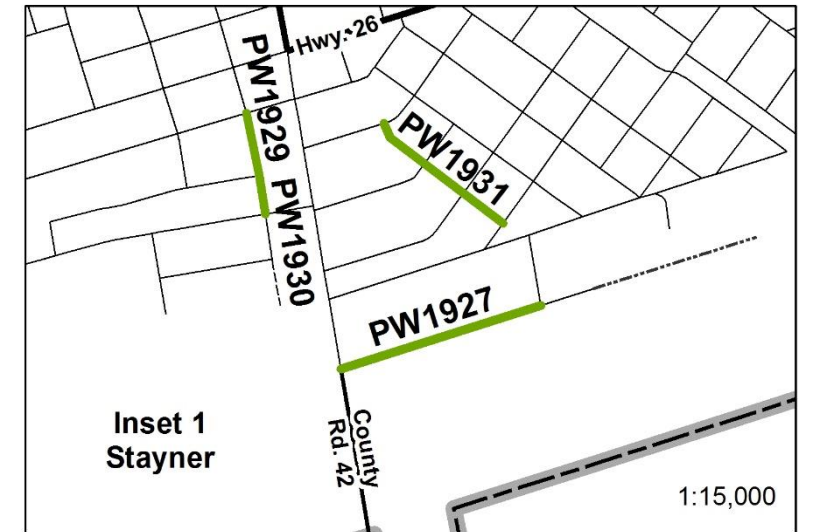
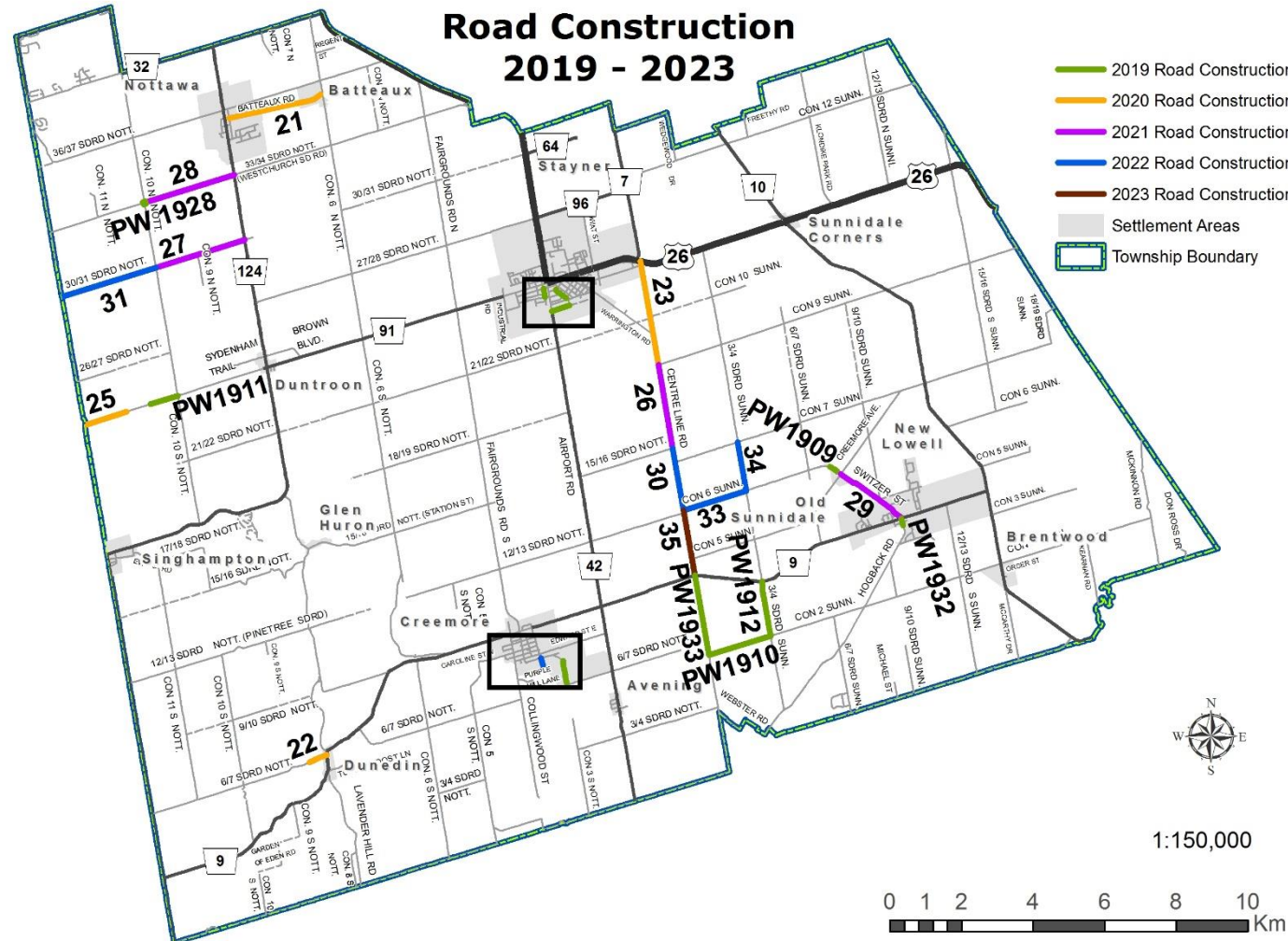
2 sewer systems – 6 water systems

Main reservoir to Margaret St., dig a new water well for Stayner expansion and water line along Mary St.

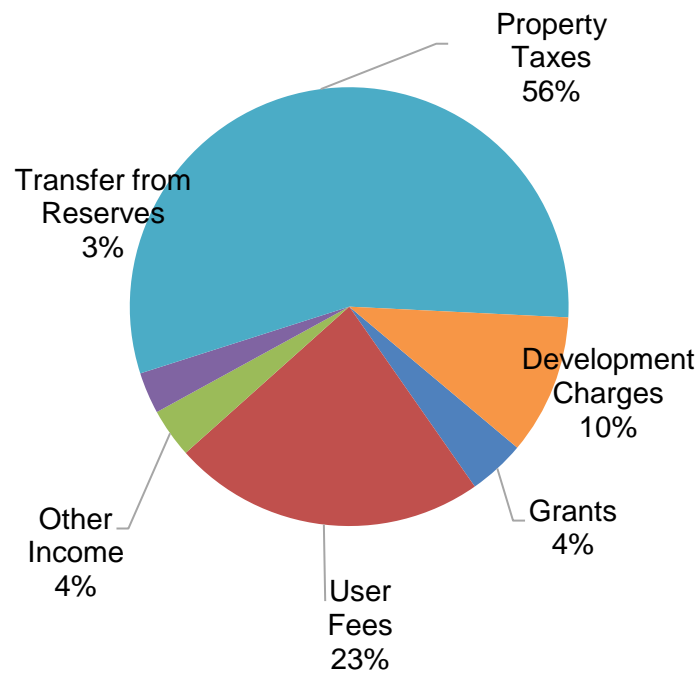
Sewer Services – Stayner

Various equipment replacements.

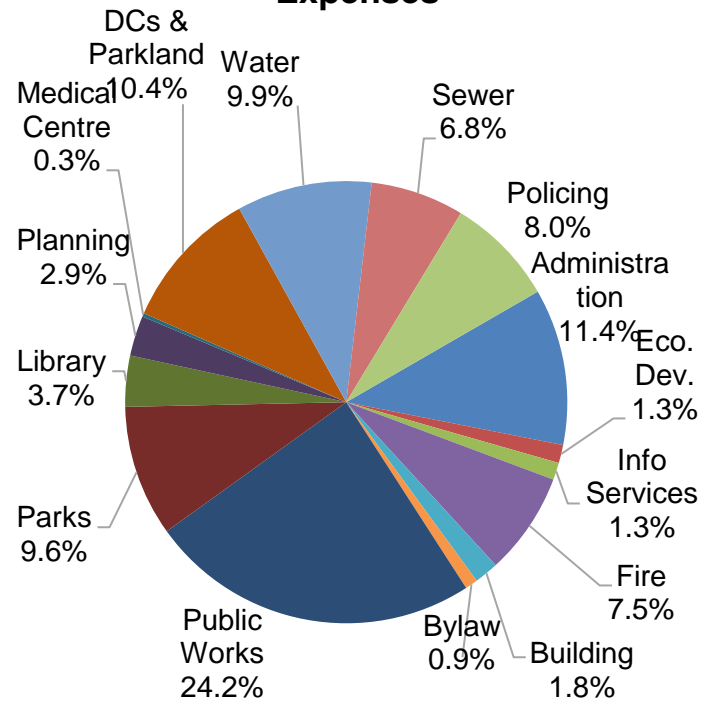


Where the Money comes from and how it is Spent – by Department

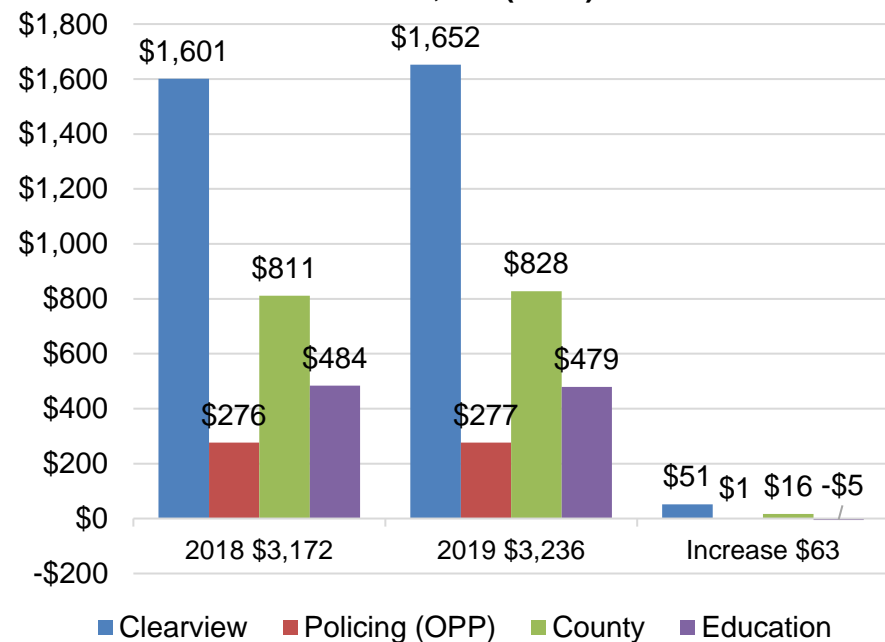
\$28,617,052 in Total 2019 Revenues



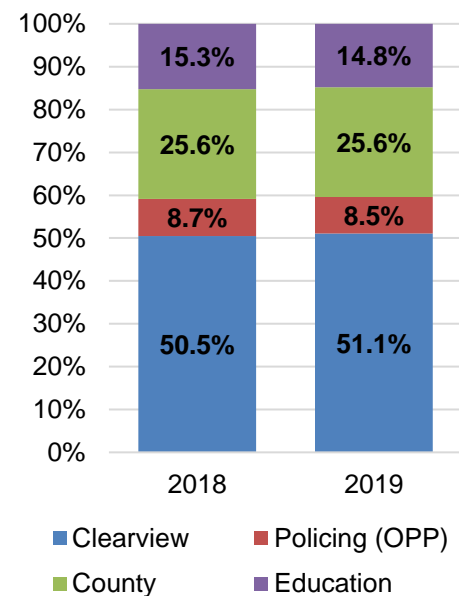
\$28,617,052 in Total 2019 Expenses

2019-2023 Corporate Budget Overview and Highlights

The budget for taxation purposes includes an average residential tax increase of 2.00% (est.)

The residential tax rate increase includes an estimated:

- 3.20% Clearview
- 0.25% Policing
- 2.00% Simcoe County
- -1.00% Education

The estimated increase on the annual property taxes for a property assessed at \$293,334 is:

- \$51 Clearview
- \$ 1 Policing
- \$16 Simcoe County
- -\$ 5 Education
- \$63

The estimated tax for the average \$293,334 assessed home would be (see chart on back):

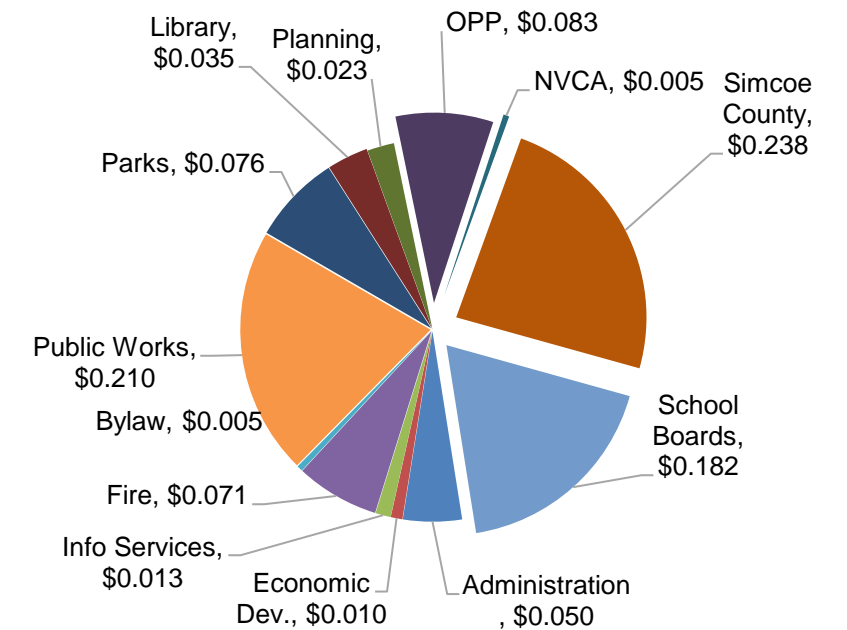
- \$1,652 Clearview
- \$ 277 Policing (OPP)
- \$ 828 Simcoe County
- \$ 479 School Boards
- \$3,236 Total

Almost 2.39% of the 3.20% Clearview increase is due to:

- 0.79% increase Parks & Rec. project funding
- 0.61% improve Youth Centre services
- 0.58% increase reserves
- 0.41% Creemore bus route

How Your Tax Dollars Are Spent

\$0.48 of each 2019 \$1.00 goes to Clearview



Property tax is the primary source of revenue to deliver municipal services. User fees, grants, and development charges are among additional sources of revenue. Water delivery, sewer collection, building inspection and the Creemore Medical Centre services do not receive funding from municipal property taxes. Policing costs are billed together with the Clearview tax levy.

Total Municipal Budget - \$46.1 million

- \$27.9 million - Municipal Operating Budget
- \$18.1 million - Municipal Capital Budget
