2019-2023 Corporate Budget Overview and Highlights

The budget for taxation purposes includes an average residential tax increase of 2.85% (est.)

The residential tax rate increase includes an estimated:

- 5.99% Clearview
- -0.25% Policing
- 0.87% Simcoe County
- -2.41% Education

The estimated increase on the annual property taxes for a property assessed at \$293,334 is:

- \$96 Clearview
- -\$ 1 Policing
- \$ 7 Simcoe County
- -\$12 Education
- \$91

The estimated tax for the average \$293,334 assessed home would be (see chart on back):

\$1,697 Clearview

\$ 275 Policing (OPP)

\$ 818 Simcoe County

\$ 472 School Boards



Almost 4.63% of the 5.99% Clearview increase is due to:

- 2.30% to increase reserves including \$250,000 increase to bridges reserves to fund the replacement/repair of 13 bridges over the next 12 years
- 1.31% to increase funding of Parks and Rec. Projects
- 0.61% improve Youth Centre services
- 0.41% Creemore bus route

How Your Tax Dollars Are Spent

\$0.49 of each 2019 \$1.00 in property taxes goes to Clearview



Property tax is the primary source of revenue to deliver municipal services. User fees, grants, and development charges are among additional sources of revenue. Water delivery, sewer collection, building inspection and the Creemore Medical Centre services do not receive funding from municipal property taxes. Policing costs are billed together with the Clearview tax levy.

Total Municipal Budget - \$47.4 million

- \$28.9 million Municipal Operating Budget
- \$18.5 million Municipal Capital Budget
