5. Business arising from the Minutes

5.1 Survey

The Board discussed the received survey results (attached). The survey ran from May 14, 2021 until May 31, 2021. The survey received a total of 121 responses.

Jason presented information from the Hall Board Chairs meeting (attached) and discussed the direction of the Halls.

The Board discussed the direction with the small hall renovations, AODA, and moving forward. Mayor Measures did not participate in the conversation or votes as presented. Councillor Phyllis Dineen abstained from both votes.

Resolution:

Moved by Calvin Phillips, seconded by Jordy Lacko, Be It Resolved that the Nottawa Hall Board hereby direct Council and Staff to move forward with a decision without direction from the Board as the Board is not willing to finance the proposed 25%.

Resolution:

Moved by Kari Mirrlees, seconded by Calvin Phillips, Be It Resolved that the Nottawa Hall Board hereby accept the survey results as presented and provide to Council.

5.2 Scrap Metal Drive

Councillor Phyllis Dineen informed the Board that the scrap metal drive raised a final total of \$6,000 for the Nottawa Hall.

Additional donations were donated at the scrap yard. The Hall Board sincerely thanks everyone who participated.

5.3 Booking software update

Jason discussed the software with the General Manager of Parks, Culture, and Recreation, Terry Vachon and no software is available at this time.

5.4 Small Halls Festival

The Board discussed the event and do not plan to participate.

6.2 Reimbursement for Flowers

7. Maintenance Report

Maintenance Manager, Calvin Phillips informed the Board that there is not much happening however there has been a renter which will require a Volunteer to take garbage and recycling out for Friday pick up. Calvin suggested reinstating a receptacle as things begin to re-open.

Mayor Measures reminded the Board that internet will also need to be considered moving forward with re-opening.

8. Bookings Update

Kari Mirrlees informed the Board that she is in receipt of a potential rental. The potential renter inquired regarding a kitchen rental with additional electrical outlets installed for equipment, lock on the kitchen, a patrician, and security system on the building to protect their equipment at their own expense. Kari has encouraged the potential renter to prepare a proposal and COVID safety plan, prior to creating an agreement.

Kalvin informed the Board that the current kitchen rental has been booked for and paid up until June 24th, 2021. The Board discussed the special rate and the closing of the current three-month agreement.

Kalvin informed the Board on tentative bookings; wedding in October, and a Buck and Doe spring 2022 contingent on provincial and health unit restrictions.

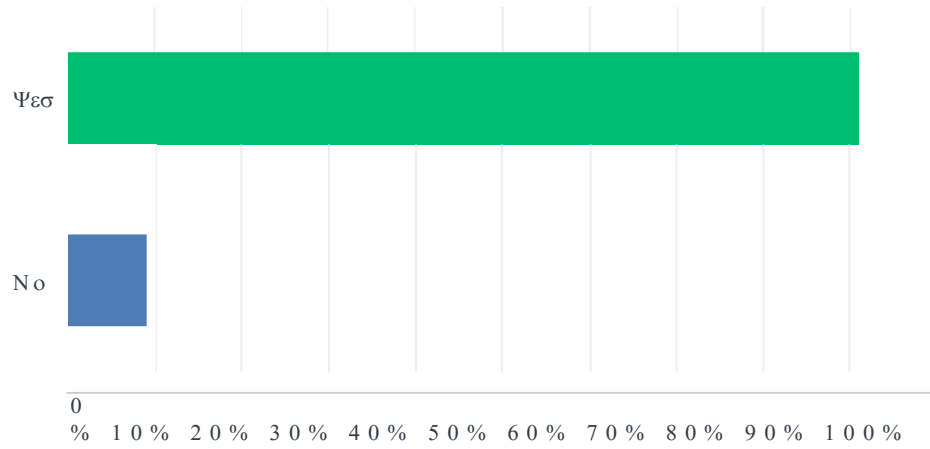

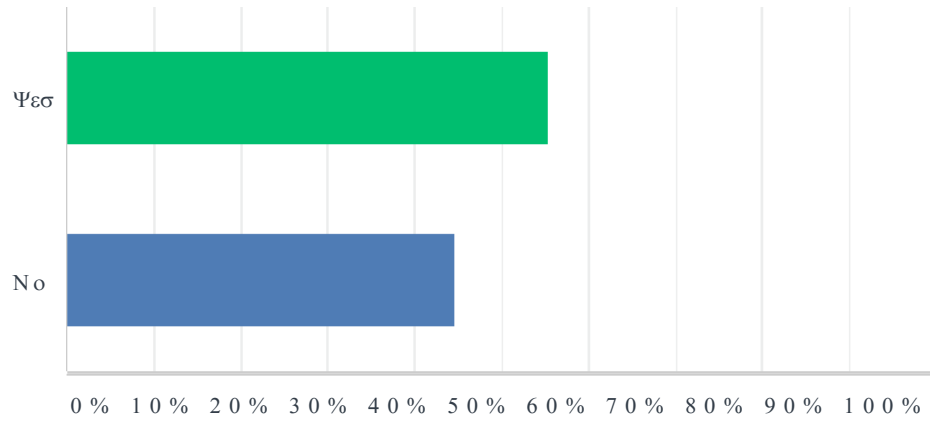

Q5 Have you ever rented the Hall?

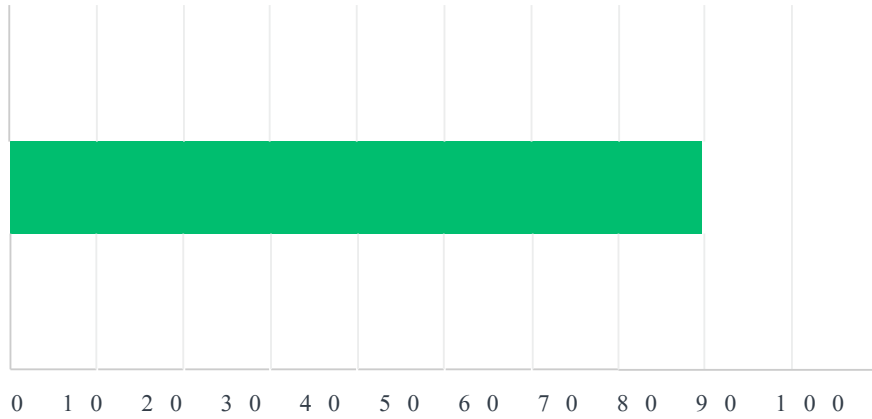

Q6 How important do you feel the Hall is to the Community; 0 Not Important – 100 Very Important

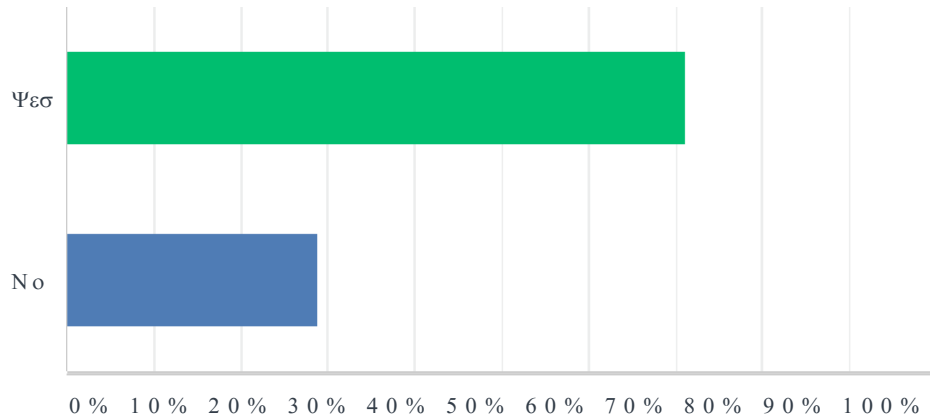

Q12 How have YOU contributed to the Nottawa Hall in the past? (select all that apply)

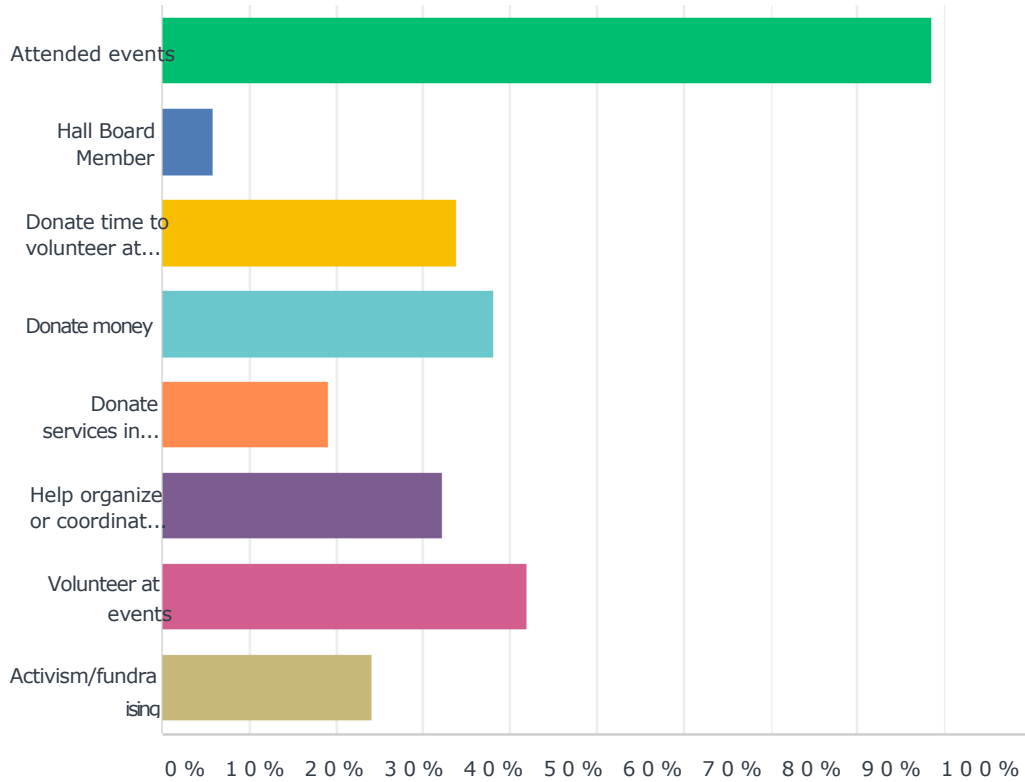
