Council Meeting Highlights March 2nd, 2020

Councillor Ward 1 Oath of Office

The vacant seat for Ward 1 on Clearview Council was officially filled as Phyllis Dineen, Councillor Ward 1 was sworn-in by taking her oath of office.

Councillor Dineen was also appointed to the Nottawa Hall Board.

Sign By-law Presentation 2020

Mara Burton, Director Community Services presented the proposed New Sign By-law, updating the current version passed in 2008. The new by-law will address technologies not originally covered, Developer signage, safety and ease of use.

Council directed staff to hold a Public meeting for the proposed New Sign By-law.

Community Assistance Grant Request

Council approved a Community Assistance Grant in the amount of \$4,500 to the Kinsmen Club of Stayner for their first annual Cider & Sausage event to be held on July 18th at Kinsmen Park in Stayner.

Hall Board Facility Assessment Presentation and Report

General Manager, Parks, Culture, Recreation, Terry Vachon, presented the Hall Board Facility Assessment completed by R.J. Burnside. The report updates a 2012 report and details the improvement costs to bring six of our Community Halls up to date for accessibility. The two options presented project a grand total of \$5,100,000 (modified) to \$7,980,000 (full) to complete modified and full Facility Accessibility Design Standard (FADS) updates.

Council directed staff to hold a Public Brainstorming workshop in March and to schedule meetings with Council and each Hall Board individually after the Workshop to determine next steps.



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Building Department Annual Fee Report

In accordance with the Building Code Act, the Building Department presented their annual report for January to December 2019.

In 2019 the Building Department generated a contribution to reserves of \$395,601.39 in 2019, resulting in a \$933,217.65 balance in reserves.

Clearview Youth Centre Report for Information

Since Youth Centre operations were taken over by the Parks, Culture and Recreation Department in 2019 the Centre has established monthly programming, updated the interior of the Centre and established partnerships with groups such as the Canadian Mental Health Association, The Gilbert Centre, Clearview Public Library and the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit.

The Centre has raised \$35,000 in funding and serves an average of 6-15 youth per program night.

Simcoe Gardens Zoning By-law Amendment

Council approved By-law 20-18 amending the zoning in the Simcoe Gardens subdivision from Residential Multiple Low-Density Hold (RS3-H2) to Residential Medium Density Exception Hold (RS4-8-H2). This amendment sets the specific zone requirements for the Townhouse development on the corner of Louisa Street and Simcoe Street in Stayner.

Simcoe County's Annual #ITSTARTS Campaign – March 2020

In Simcoe County March is #ITSTARTS month. In conjunction with The Local Immigration Partnership, Simcoe County runs the annual campaign to increase public awareness and engage communities in discussions about racism and discrimination.
