## Council Meeting Highlights September 27<sup>th</sup>, 2021

### **Jarlette Health Services – Stayner Care Centre**

Julia King, on behalf of Jarlette Health Services, made a deputation to Council to ask for an exemption from/reduction of Development Charges (DC's) and/or an innovative and collaborative strategy to offset potential DC's for the redevelopment of the Centre, planning for which began in 2016.

Council directed staff to report back on a discount of the development charges for the existing building, a 50% discount on development charges for additional new beds, a discount on development charges for job creation, or other strategies to offset the development charges. A report will be brought to a future Council Meeting.

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### **Centre Street Crossing Guard**

Council approved removing the school guard crossing at Centre Street and County Road 42 in Stayner. Recent developments in the subdivision on the west side of County Road 42 has allowed for a new walking route for students.

### **Proposed Extension of Interim Control By-law 20-64 to prohibit the establishment of Cannabis Cultivation and Production Facilities**

Council passed By-law 21-97, extending Interim Control By-law 20-64 that prohibits the establishment of cannabis cultivation and cannabis production facilities in the Township of Clearview for one additional year until October 5, 2022. Interim control by-laws are permitted to be in effect for one year and then to be extended for one additional year, for a total of two years.

The draft by-law incorporating the comments and feedback from the August 23, 2021 Public Meeting will be brought to a future Council Meeting.

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### **COVID-19 Vaccination Policy**

Council received report HR-002-2021 regarding the Township's COVID-19 Vaccination Policy and supported that members of Council be required to comply with the policy. This was passed with the understanding that as elected officials certain parts of the policy does not apply where it relates to employee status or accommodations.
